Impacts on Port Moody Communities

- 540 community members engaged (285 youth) 1,500 hours contributed
- 240 community members learned how climate change impacts them locally and developed habitat restoration skills
- 135 community members introduced to Port Moody Parks for the first time

Ecological impacts



- 200 Cubic metres of invasive plants removed
- 160 native plants, shrubs and trees planted
