

Food Service at the Port Moody Station Museum

The Port Moody Heritage Society (PMHS) wants to provide food service at the Port Moody Station Museum. The purpose is to provide visitors with a food option, as many museums do, and provide an auxiliary funding stream to support museum operations.

As per our agreement with the City, City permission is required for additional site uses.

The PMHS has been in discussions with Fred Soofi for a number of years. Options have been discussed with the plan being a semi-permanent food truck. An agreement will be made between PMHS and Fred Soofi such that Fred Soofi's food truck will be the only truck on site.

Site Location:

The truck would be located near the Venosta Railcar. A grey water tie in would be made to the sanitary sewer requiring a plumbing license. The truck would remain on site and not leave daily.

Hours of Operation:

Operation would generally be daily, year around. Daily hours will vary and be adjusted to customer demand.

Use of Venosta Railcar:

Outdoor seating would be patio style on the platform utilizing picnic tables. Indoor seating would be onboard the railcar. Venosta seating would on be on times that the railcar is not being used for educational programs. Guests would seat themselves.

The single, multi-gender washroom on board would be used by abled-bodied people. Those requiring an accessible washroom would utilize facilities in Rocky Point Park, the same as Museum visitors do now.

Waste Handling

All customer service items/ customer waste will be compostable or returnable. Compostable will be put through the City's Green Bin system. Returnable items will be collected and sent to Return-It.

Food Truck packaging will be send through recycling; used cooking oil/grease will handled by a collection company.
