

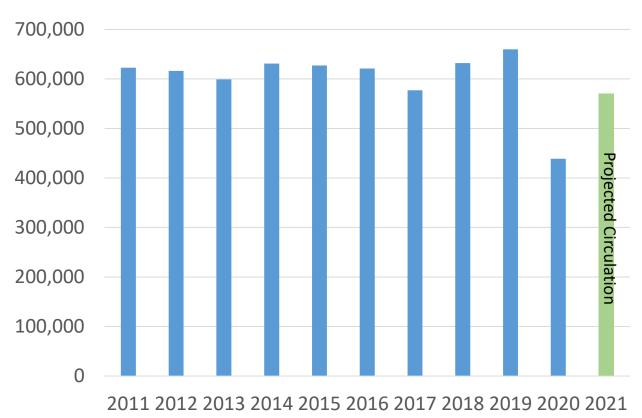

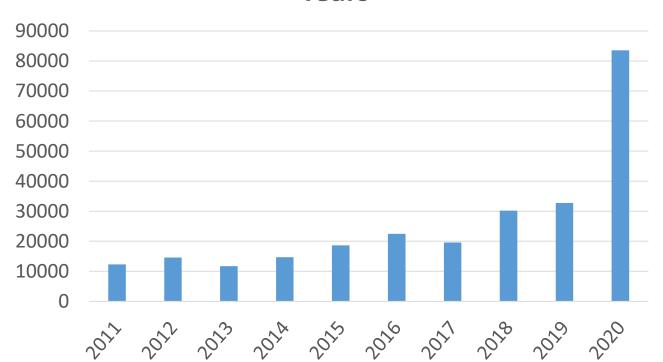


#### **Total Circulation - Last Ten Years**

## Assumptions:

- Vaccination rates will continue to improve leading to a full return to normal sometime in 2022
- The budget should be prepared allowing for normal, prepandemic service levels
- Revenue will improve in 2022, but it will not fully recover to pre-pandemic levels
- Cuts should be made by analyzing 3 year averages and in accord with zero-based budgeting principles
- No new capital or operating projects should be included unless they are funded through library reserves.
