Subject: Input on the Culvert Report

Purpose

To provide Council with information regarding a resolution passed by the Environmental Protection Committee regarding a review of the Culvert Report.

Recommended Resolution

THAT the report dated October 26, 2021 from the Environmental Protection Committee regarding Input on the Culvert Report be received for information.

Background

At the Regular Council Meeting of June 22, 2021, a report from Councillor Milani on the use of culverts in residential redevelopment was referred to the Environmental Protection Committee for review and comment. At the September 20, 2021 Environmental Protection Committee meeting, the Committee received presentations related to watercourses and regulatory requirements for instream works and culverting from the Ministry of Forest, Lands, Natural Resource Operations, and Rural Development (Attachment 1), the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (Attachment 2), and staff (Attachment 3). At the October 18, 2021 Environmental Protection Committee meeting, the Committee undertook a roundtable discussion on issues related to culverting and passed the following resolution:

EPC21/018

THAT an update about information on ditches, culverts, and jurisdiction be provided to Council:

AND THAT the presentation on the progress on the recommendations on the Moody Centre Stormwater Management Servicing Plan be forwarded to Council for information;

AND THAT education about the benefits of different watercourse and ditch options be provided to the public;

AND THAT provincial support for homeowners in order to implement green infrastructure projects for compensation in the City of Port Moody be explored.

Discussion

The Environmental Protection Committee suggested that Council receive the information that was presented to the Committee and noted that adding further discussion on the culverting report to the Committee's work plan would negatively impact progress on other work plan items. As identified in the Moody Centre Stormwater Management Servicing Plan, the Committee advised that the information about the classification of ditches in City documentation is inconsistent, including the Chines Integrated Stormwater Management Plan, the Official Community Plan, and Zoning Bylaw. The Committee highlighted the increasing importance of ditches and watercourses to manage watersheds and stormwater, flooding, and to support biodiversity due to climate change. The Committee noted that these features can be very challenging to manage during the redevelopment process and that costs associated with enclosures of some watercourses are high.

Other Options
