Zoning Bylaws

- The Zoning Bylaw (https://www.portmoody.ca/en/business-and-development/zoning-bylaw.aspx?mid_26643) regulates land use in the City of Port Moody. Commercial uses must be aligned with approved uses in the prescribed zone. Uses are divided into Principal Uses, which are the primary uses in a zone, and Secondary Uses, which are auxiliary to the Principal Uses. If you would like operate a business that is significantly different from what the Zoning Bylaw allows, you need to apply for Rezoning (<https://www.portmoody.ca/en/business-and-development/ocp-amendmentrezoning.aspx>). If the use is short term, a Temporary Use Permit (<https://www.portmoody.ca/en/business-and-development/temporary-use-permit.aspx>) could be an option. Both Rezoning and Temporary Use Permit applications are required to be approved by Council.
