
Survey respondents were asked a series of questions about the importance of City services and programs, and balancing service levels and tax rates. Some respondents did not answer all questions.






























# Service Levels and Taxation

Respondents were asked to rate the overall value of City services and programs listed above in relation to the taxes and utility fees that they pay.






Respondents were asked how Council should balance service levels and tax rates in 2022
