

Memo to Council From the Office of Mayor Rob Vagramov

Subject:	Request to inquire about the renaming of Indian Arm

On Monday September 20, 2022 the Mayor's office received an email from the Salish Sea Research and Education Society requesting support for the renaming of "Indian Arm" in the spirit of First Nation reconciliation.

During a meeting with the Port of Vancouver, it was indicated that such a name change would be feasible, and that their Board would have the ability to receive a request to this effect.

The memo recommends the following resolution:

THAT the City of Port Moody call on the Port of Vancouver, and relevant levels of government to change the name of the inlet known today as "*Indian Arm*" in the spirit of First Nation reconciliation;

AND THAT the name selection for the renaming of the inlet known today as *"Indian Arm"* be First Nations driven;

AND THAT the Salish Sea Research and Education Society be thanked for raising the issue of renaming the inlet known today as "*Indian Arm*".
