4.2 Chief Ed Hall, kwikwətləm (Kwikwetlem) First Nation

Chief Ed Hall entered the meeting at this point.

The Chair welcomed Chief Ed Hall to the meeting after reading the City of Port Moody's territorial acknowledgment, and noted that the Committee intends to establish a close relationship with the kwikwəÅəm (Kwikwetlem) First Nation.

Chief Ed Hall noted the following:

- kwikwedam (Kwikwetlem) First Nation is working on multiple projects at the moment, including indigenous art installations, crosswalks for truth and reconciliation, talks, and the Welcome Post Project;
- the Red Fish Healing Centre for Mental Health and Addiction, a 105-bed facility for adults, opened in October 2021;
- Maples Adolescent Treatment Centre, opened in 2019, addresses the mental health needs of young people (12 to 17 years old);
- both facilities offer LifeSkills training, addictions counselling, workshops, and Indigenous crafting, and there are indigenous art pieces and murals in both buildings;
- kwikwedam (Kwikwetlem) First Nation recently signed a service agreement with the City of Port Coquitlam, and started planning for the development of reserve lands;
- a health services building on reserve land is a possibility;
- revenue generating activities and projects to support kwikwaham (Kwikwetlem) First Nation's activities have not been explored yet but could be planned for the future;
- there are 126 members of kwikwałam (Kwikwetlem) First Nation, some live in the U.S. and collaboration with the municipalities in the region is positive;

- ideas including enhancing waterways to move canoes or storytelling could be explored for increasing tourist activities in the area;
- there aren't any current projects between nations, but opportunities may be explored in the future;
- oral histories and traditions provide information about territorial relationships and overlaps; and
- some areas in the region were frequently travelled, but not every area had a village site.

The Manager of Economic Development noted that there is not a set timeline for the Economic Development Master Plan given the pace of change.

The Chair noted that a copy of the Economic Development Master Plan could be provided to Chief Ed Hall, and the Committee looks forward to collaboration opportunities with kwikwaham (Kwikwetlem) First Nation in the future.

Chief Ed Hall left the meeting at this point and did not return.

The Manager of Economic Development noted the following:

- Invest Vancouver was one of the organizations identified in the Economic Development Master Plan for collaboration regarding the strategy of attracting office-based employment including tech;
- three integrated functional focus areas of Invest Vancouver are conducting research and policy analysis, fostering collaboration, and attracting strategic investment;
- for some of these areas, individual municipalities do not have the capacity to create meaningful connections or bring a comprehensive vision; and
- attracting strategic investment focus area is in need of attention, and Invest Vancouver is working on to bring more depth to this area.
