1.2 Verbal Report: Councillor Knowles

Councillor Knowles introduced the evening's Art at Council, an oil painting entitled "The Answer" by artist Crystal Noir. Councillor Knowles noted that Ms. Noir is an emerging self-taught artist of Jamaican and Ukrainian descent from Vancouver, and that this painting and others are displayed at their current exhibition titled *Shades of Self* at PoMoArts. Councillor Knowles invited the artist to speak.

The artist noted that they had taught themselves to paint during the pandemic beginning three years ago, and that the encouragement of others led them to continue to pursue their passion. The artist noted that their exhibition will be running until May 4, 2023.

Council thanked the artist for sharing their art.
