- Inclusive recognition: emphasized the need for broader recognition, not only of First Nations culture but also of other cultures such as Sikh and Asian communities, as they are integral parts of Port Moody's history.
- Moving away from a single narrative: There is a desire to shift the perception of Port Moody's history to
 embrace and celebrate the diverse cultural influences that have contributed to its heritage and identity.
- Stakeholder drew attention to the presence of boulders in the area that might be "Story Stones"
 according to First Nations legends, representing individuals transformed into stone. It was suggested to
 integrate these stones into the project to honor First Nations storytelling traditions. It was also mentioned
 that placing a hand on the stones allows one to hear them singing, emphasizing the potential for a
 unique sensory experience that could engage visitors and deepen their connection to the cultural
 significance of the site.
