



#### Dear City of Port Moody Mayor and Council,

Over the past couple of years, the GoHere Washroom Access Program gained significant media attention as well as support from members of the public and businesses. Currently, the doors to over 3,000 washrooms located across the country have been opened to the public due to the participation of businesses, organizations and government locations in the GoHere program. There are 300,000 Canadians live with Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis, the two main forms of inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). For these patients, improved washroom access in our communities is extremely important.

Volunteers with Crohn's and Colitis Canada are looking to expand the program in British Columbia.

Today, we are inviting the <u>City of Port Moody</u> to join the GoHere Washroom Access Program.

#### **The Opportunity**

To raise awareness and increase washroom access, Crohn's and Colitis Canada launched the GoHere Washroom Access Program. Crohn's and Colitis Canada is the only national, volunteer-based charity focused on finding cures for Crohn's and colitis as well as improving the lives of people affected by these chronic diseases. The GoHere program seeks to partner with organizations, businesses and governments to increase washroom access for people who live with medical conditions related to incontinence, such as Crohn's or colitis.

The GoHere program is comprised of three key components that enable people to locate nearby washrooms when and where they need them. The three key components include:

- 1. GoHere Washroom Locator App: The GoHere Washroom Locator App helps identify the closest available washrooms anywhere across Canada. You can plan a route, making it easy to locate washrooms along the way. The GoHere app is available on iPhone and Android.
- 2. GoHere Washroom Access Cards: A special feature of the GoHere program is the virtual GoHere Washroom Access Card which people can use to show proof of medical need when trying to access a washroom. The card acts as a safeguard for people facing emergencies and needing access to a location which has yet to join the GoHere program.
- **3. GoHere Decal** *(optional):* Participating locations are identified by members of the public due to the placement of the optional GoHere decal on public-facing windows. The decal signals to people with incontinence that the location's washrooms are open and available for use, no questions asked.

Often, Crohn's and colitis patients sadly report being turned away from organizations in times of washroom emergency or are required to buy something before being able to use a washroom. The GoHere App's goal is to identify washrooms in our communities that can be used, no questions asked.

#### **How You Can Support**

Municipal facilities have been identified as locations that can be added to the GoHere App. Most city facilities, like recreation centres, libraries and certain parks are already known to have public washrooms. It is just a matter of putting these locations onto the App, so those requiring a washroom, especially those travelling into areas in the city they are not familiar with, can locate the closest available washroom. We would like to seek permission from cities to make these additions to the GoHere Washroom Access Program.





Today, I'm asking whether the City of Port Moody would be willing to approve our request and provide a list of facilities that we can add to the App. Attached to the email is an excel file with 4 columns of information we would require: Location name, address, comments, and hours of operation.

The GoHere Washroom Access Program has had success with government partnerships across the country. (See media links below). In February 2023, the City of Coquitlam became the first city in BC to join the initiative. In 2015, former Mayor Naheed Nenshi joined the campaign and added municipal facilities in Calgary to the GoHere washroom app. In 2016, Mississauga became the first city in Ontario to officially participate. Several other Canadian municipalities have joined, while encouraging their local business communities with accessible washrooms to also join the program. In 2018, Crohn's and Colitis Canada partnered with the Government of Canada to add 20 locations to the app, and in 2020, expanded that partnership to 74 federal government buildings.

Over 33,000 British Columbians live with IBD, but the app is not necessarily just for these individuals. Anyone requiring frequent and urgent need of a washroom that lives with gastrointestinal, bladder, or other medical conditions (like neurological disorders and certain forms of cancer) can also benefit from the GoHere program.

Your participation will enable people living with Crohn's or colitis and other incontinence issues to break free from the anxiety, fear and stress they face when leaving their homes. We look forward to hearing from you. Please contact me if you have any questions.
