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## Good afternoon members of Port Moody council.

At times, I am not sure that the council understands the 'forever' decision that they are about to make. Port Moody, going all the way back to its founding as the terminus for the Canadian Pacific Railway, has a special place in the hearts of Canadians. This community is so unique in so many ways and deserves to be protected and respected.

There are already huge high rise communities being built on either side of Port Moody centre which will already dramatically increase traffic congestion and the public use of limited city facilities. But of greater concern is protecting the 'human scale' that has made Port Moody such a special place to live. Paving over and wiping out all that makes Port Moody unique is a terrible route to go. The geographical limitations of downtown Port Moody make large format high rise projects unworkable and it will reduce the movement of goods and services through the region and reduce the quality of life for all. Large towers create shadows and a sterile monolithic environment. In Europe and other parts of the world, they would never dream of imposing such a dramatic change on a historically important city.

There are already way too many of these high rise buildings in the planning / building stages and this is the most short sighted decision I've ever witnessed by council.

Council often speaks of being 'concerned for families' and the well-being of the middle class but these types of massive towers are the opposite of that. Families, seniors and others want developments that

are thoughtful of place and on a scale that is community focused. Building up to six stories is a much better way to go. This allows for a more 'gentle' density

in the heart of the city, a gathering place and cultural centre for all. It is impractical to raise a family in a large high rise and it is also impractical for seniors as well.

Major world cities like Paris have mostly six story apartment buildings which respects history and supports a vibrant street life and culture.

I am very concerned and perplexed why Port Moody City council is in such a race to turn Port Moody into a sterile and soulless community where maximum density is the only concern. This development will be permanent and will change the city forever. Building smaller, more thoughtfully is in the city's long term interest.

If the council goes ahead and builds these giant towers it will destroy the quality of life that Port Moody is known for. Any tower, whether it be 40, 60, or 80 stories won't, on their own, "solve" the current housing crisis in any way. As we all know, that can only be solved by managing immigration flows into the country; a federal responsibility.

Please please don't ruin Port Moody. If council proceeds, this will be your legacy.

The community and all the people and families I speak with in my neighbourhood are NOT in favour of these projects in the city centre. Please listen to the will of the people.
