**6. New Business**

**6.1 Port Moody Police Department - Transportation Committee**

Presentation: Sam Zacharias & Vincent Traitetti, Port Moody Police Department

The presenter gave an on-table presentation titled “Port Moody Police Department – Transportation Committee” regarding the Port Moody Police Department (PMPD) including: current complaints being received, year-to-date incident statistics, speed trailer program, TRAC collaboration at Panorama Drive, ICBC partnership on road safety, MADD Canada ‘Top 5’, recent notable files, and collaborative efforts with adjacent police agencies to support road blocks due to a lack of resources.

In response to questions, members were informed that PMPD are dealing with ongoing concerns regarding uninsurable dirt bikes being driven on public roads, often by youth not of legal driving age.

**6.2 Road Safety in Our Community**

Presentation: Kate Woochuk, ICBC Representative

The presenter gave an on-table presentation titled “ICBC Road Safety and Community Engagement” highlighting ICBC’s road safety initiatives and community engagement efforts related to distracted driving, auto crime, high risk driving, Motorcycle Skills Event, impaired driving, pedestrian safety, Road Safety Speaker Program, ICBC Road Improvement Program, and a 2024 grant made to improve safety in Port Moody.

Staff commented on the benefits of collaboration between city staff, Port Moody Police Department, and ICBC on road safety matters.

**6.3 Bedwell Bay Road - Metro Vancouver Regional Greenway**

Presentation: Nobinur Rahman, Transportation Engineer

Staff gave an on-table presentation titled “Bedwell Bay Road Concept Design” regarding the conceptual design for the inclusion of a Multi-Use Pathway, in conjunction with Metro Vancouver, to connect loco Road with Sasamat Lake and tæmtæmíxʷtæn (formerly Belcarra) Regional Park access.

The Committee discussed the following topics:

- concerns with e-bikes and e-scooters using the multi-use path;
- adding double chevrons/bike stencils on the west side of First Avenue, on the downhill slope, to avoid conflicts with oncoming bike traffic;
- increasing the curb height at the roundabout at the Tum Tumay Whueton Drive intersection, to slow drivers down;
- costs associated with relocating the hydro pole near First Avenue, while adding stanchions and bollards nearby; and
- phasing the project in conjunction with loco utility upgrades to make the area more active transportation friendly.

In response to questions, staff informed the Committee that:

- road constraints limit design opportunities on both sides of loco Road;
- connecting the section between April Road and First Avenue will be considered as part of a future loco Road utility improvement project;
- reduced height of the concrete barrier near Sunnyside Road/Crystal Creek Drive is to improve sight lines;
- staff will reexamine relocation of the hydro pole near First Avenue;
- construction timing is currently unknown; and
- funding is currently secured for design, not capital construction.

#### **6.4 Electric Scooter and Electric Bike Share Program - Update**

Presentation: Nobinur Rahman, Transportation Engineer

Staff gave a presentation titled “Electric Scooter and Electric Bike Share Program” updating the Committee on the project.

The Committee discussed the following topics:

- using data on St. Johns Street to promote pedestrian and active transportation improvements; and
- the map showing where people access the App most are near Skytrain, community centres, and schools along St. Johns Street.


