INTRODUCTION

The applicant is applying for what will essentially be a replacement liquor primary licence at 3224 St. John's Street, Port Moody, to create a pub with a modern pub culture to serve the business and residents of the immediate community. The proposed liquor primary licensed area is for a pub-style establishment with a proposed total capacity of approximately 250 persons (including staff).

Livelyhood will be a fun, dynamic upscale liquor primary establishment which will cater to the diverse population and business community of the Port Moody area. The applicant will draw guest such as tourists within the area along with local residences from the Port Moody, Port Coquitlam, Coquitlam and Burnaby areas.

The establishment has previously held a liquor primary licence for this exact location. However, after a lengthy period of dormancy they were not able to extend the dormancy period and therefore, they are applying for a new licence for the same area that will have a new design, layout and operators.

Attached is a copy of the previous liquor primary license and the floor plan along with a plan of the new proposed area.

HOURS OF OPERATION

The proposed hours of licensing for this liquor primary licence are 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. seven days per week as was previously approved for the Brew Street establishment that used to reside at this location.

ENTERTAINMENT

The entertainment in this pub will include background music along with some live entertainment that will support the local musician community. Additionally, there will be TV monitors available for guests to enjoy occasional sporting events. This pub will provide exceptional food and beverage service in a modern pub culture environment. The applicant will ensure compliance with the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch policies for a liquor primary licensed establishment.

FOOD SERVICE

This pub will provide exceptional food and beverage service in a modern pub culture environment.

Livelyhood will be a unique food and beverage environment with an extensive menu of hot and cold items with appetizers, entrees & desserts. The menu is based around homemade comfort food, with different daily specials.

Beverages range from local craft beers, wine, coolers, spirits and non-alcoholic soft drinks.

TARGET MARKET

The location of this pub is such that it will cater to three distinct groups including: residents of Port Moody, Port Coquitlam, Coquitlam and Burnaby, the business people working in the surrounding offices and businesses and tourists visiting Port Moody seeking a modern pub culture experience. The target market group will be primarily 30-50 years of age with a variety of occupations. It is expected the majority of patrons will be urban locals with some tourist patrons.

The proposed site is in an area of Port Moody that has very few liquor primary establishments (2 within a 3 km radius).

This area is currently seeing significant growth in both population and small business. Given the significant population of the area and the size of the business community to be served, the applicant will focus on providing a quality pub experience for the residential and business community of this area.

COMPOSITION OF NEIGHBOURHOOD

The new proposed liquor primary licensed establishment is located in the Port Moody area. Within this area there are a variety of mixed uses items with the most prominent being, residential, and urban commercial.

This area is currently seeing significant growth in both population and small business. Given the significant population of the area and the size of the business community to be served, the applicant will focus on providing a quality pub experience for the residential and business community of this area.

The following is a list of the social facilities and public buildings in the immediate area of the site:

- Koko's Activity Centre
- Corbeau Park

NOISE IN THE COMMUNITY

The applicant is an experienced operator, who has a well-established history with the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch and local communities where they currently operate. While it is the applicant's intent to have live music from time to time, the applicant will not permit the pub to be detrimental to the area in anyway.

The applicant will adhere to the City of Port Moody guidelines. Additionally, they have procedures in place to ensure they comply with city noise by-laws. They feel it is in their best interest to ensure no noise will negatively impact the surrounding community. Based on the above noted information, the applicant feels their presence within the community will not create additional noise.

BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY

The applicant's proposed establishment will benefit the community in the following ways:

- Employment opportunities for residents of the area;
- Provide a source of additional tax revenue for the city, the provincial and federal governments;
- Further diversify the hospitality venues available to the residents, business people and tourists to Port Moody;
- Provides an additional venue for community events, fundraisers and special events;
- Involvement in community sponsorships and activities;
- Compliment other nearby businesses in the area;
- Provide a venue for musicians to perform and therefore support local artists


OTHER FACTORS
