4. New Business

The Club – A Gathering Place for Those Over 50

- 4.0 Gerry Nuttall, President of The Club, gave a presentation on The Club's history, services, and activities offered to seniors in the community. The Committee members viewed a video on The Club A Gathering Place for Those Over 50 and the following was noted:
 - The Club was opened to encourage seniors to socialize and to provide a place to gather;
 - the cost to participate in most activities is by donation;
 - the activities offered include field trips, concerts, movie nights, barbeques, golf tournaments, cruises, Mother's Day tea, Friday night socials, Christmas dinners, and cribbage tournaments;
 - the partnerships with Metro Vancouver and the City of Port Moody allow for low cost events and food services;
 - the membership rate is \$15 per year and The Club currently has 260 members; and
 - the goal for 2020 is to provide a daytime shuttle service to shut-in seniors living with no access to transportation.

Staff and Committee members discussed what the ideal seniors centre would encompass and the following was noted:

- a larger space to host events that could attract a larger group of participants and increase membership;
- a gathering place for all ages with separate youth and senior programming and programming where youth and seniors mentor each other;
- a theatre: and
- a mixed-use facility that is volunteer-run with staff support.

Seniors' Facilities and Centre Tour – Discussion

- 4.1 The Chair requested committee members' feedback on the Tour and Committee members noted the following:
 - two of the facilities toured were recreation centres, not dedicated seniors facilities:
 - the Surrey City Council established a low membership fee for their centre; and
 - the most desirable features noted were the youth volunteer programs, bowling greens, proximity to recreation centres, open architecture, art, pottery, and woodworking facilities, volunteers with vehicles to provide transportation, and health promotion and disease prevention services on site.

December 5, 2019 File: 01-0360-20-53-01/2019 The Manager of Policy Planning noted that the Committee could work with a Consultant to guide the vision for the ideal centre and once the framework for the centre was developed, it could assist developers to respond to the needs of the community.

The Manager of Policy Planning further noted that funding may be available through UBCM and New Horizons for Seniors Program to assist in developing the vision.

Mr. Nuttall left the meeting at this point and did not return.

Year-End Review

4.2 The Manager of Policy Planning provided an overview of the 2019 Annual Report – Seniors Focus Committee and it was noted that the Dementia Friendly Port Moody information could be included in the annual report.
