Staff Updates

- 5.1 Staff provided the following updates:
 - Council voted to advance the Urban Forest
 Management Strategy in 2020, and push back the
 Rocky Point Park Master Plan to 2021; staff estimate
 the Urban Forest Management Strategy to be a twoyear process;
 - a screening of the film "The Pollinators" (with a Q&A panel at the end) will take place on the evening of February 29, 2020;
 - Earth Week 2020 will have a focus on pollinator plants; a planting event will take place at a City park in the spring, as part of a multi-year City project to support native pollinator plants; and
 - other Earth Week events include: Bear Essentials, interpretative walk, bat walk, and cigarette butt clean up.
