2827 British Columbia Regiment (Duke of Connaught's Own) Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

To provide program for youth to learn Canadian Armed Force by participate in fun, challenging and rewarding activities.

To help cadets to become active, responsible members of our communities. Leadership training, fitness, camping, shooting, etc

What service does your organization provide to the community?

To provide army cadet program to youth aged 12-18 via regular weekly trainings, fitness and field training activities to cadets at no cost. The Cadet Program emphasizes key values such as loyalty, professionalism, mutual responsivities and integrity.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

To cover part of the total cost (est. \$20,000) of roof and heating system replacements of the training hall to ensure the safety of the training staff and cadets.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

The community benefits from this form of youth training by receiving in return a nucleus of young persons who are responsible roles models which have achieved or completed a wide variety of skills during the training program.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

This is the first time our program is applying for city funding so have not received any community grants form any city in the past.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

Operations costs have been from local Royal Canadian Legion and the fundraising activities organized by supporting committee. This year, to cover some of \$20K of roof/hearting system costs, we applied \$7K of gaming grant which has not been confirmed.

Association of Neighbourhood Houses of BC, Sasamat Outdoor Centre

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Sasamat Outdoor Centre (SOC) is a vibrant summer camp and year-round outdoor education facility located within Belcarra Regional Park. Operating within the larger scope of the not-for-profit Association of Neighbourhood Houses of BC, one of BC's longest serving charitable organizations, SOC's programs promote diversity and inclusion, and provide age appropriate outdoor-based activities for children, youths and adults.

SOC's Mission: Enriching lives through learning and playing in the outdoors

What service does your organization provide to the community?

SOC is known for its programs for children, youth, and families. These programs emphasize personal growth through outdoor experience. SOC provides outdoor education programs and is a community resource as a facility for community groups.

Programs include a variety of summer Day Camp and Resident Camp programs for children and youth, Family Camps, Leadership for youth, a number of mini-camps for children during the year, and seniors' outings providing lunch and entertainment in the camp setting.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

The grant request supports the purchase of percussion music instruments for an Outdoor Education Music Program which will have the flexibility to be facilitated in various manners for differing age groups. This initiative will further develop the Outdoor Education Centre program, building capacity to offer more diverse and modern programming to school groups. Through innovative musical programming, staff training and new equipment, SOC seeks to inspire and engage students in a meaningful way.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

Integrating music into the repertoire of outdoor recreation activities will provide exceptional new learning opportunities for students, as well as opportunity for the Outdoor Education Centre to fulfill new areas of the BC Arts Education Curriculum. Program objectives include learning to communicate and express oneself through music; exploring relationships between place, culture, identity and belonging with music; reflecting and being mindful.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

Sasamat has not previously applied for or received a Port Moody Community Grant. City of Port Moody support is provided in part through local tax exemption governed by the City's "Permissive Tax Exemption Guidelines" and annual 'Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaw'.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

Sasamat's principal funding is through user fees, Federal Government youth employment grants, United Way and BC Government Community Grants. The attached financial

statements outline SOC's annual operating plan. Balance of funding to establish the new music program will come from incremental fundraising and donations. NOTE: Sasamat's financial year-end in March 31.

Big Sisters of BC Lower Mainland

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Since 1960, Big Sisters of BC Lower Mainland has been changing the course of young lives by providing supportive mentors to kids who need someone the most. We are committed to enabling life-changing mentoring relationships to ignite the power and potential of young people, and are a volunteer-based organization that encourages community citizenship through our three programs: Big Sisters (1-1 mentoring), Study Buddy (free tutoring to low-income families) and Go Girls! (group mentoring).

What service does your organization provide to the community?

The Big Sisters program is a one-to-one mentorship for Little Sisters (ages 7-17).

The Study Buddy program is a weekly one-to-one mentoring relationship for youth aged 7-17 that focuses on school work and is provided to low-income families that cannot afford tutoring. Go Girls! Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds a group mentoring program for at-risk youth (ages 10-14) that promotes the benefit of an active, healthy lifestyle.

These programs are supported by our experienced caseworkers.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

We are requesting funding for one session of Go Girls! in Port Moody. These funds go towards program coordinators' salaries; it covers the materials required for program activities and the coordinators' recruitment, screening, and monitoring of the program's volunteer mentors.

This after school program operates for 2 hours a week for 8 weeks. Its intent is to promote healthy living to at-risk youth and prevent common risks faced by adolescents such as eating disorders and substance abuse.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

Studies from the Boston Consulting Group, Big Brothers Big Sisters, UBC, and the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health show that for every dollar spent on mentoring programs, \$18 is returned to society and up to \$23 in the most vulnerable communities. The study also revealed that mentored girls are 2.5x more likely to be confident in their ability to be successful, 4x less likely to bully, 2x less likely to be depressed, and 3x less likely to have social anxiety.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

We have received funding from the City of Burnaby, the City of Coquitlam, the City of New Westminster, the City of Richmond, the City of Surrey, the City of Vancouver, the City of North Vancouver, the City of West Vancouver, and the City of White Rock. We have not received funding from the City of Port Moody's community grants as of yet.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe: In addition to municipal funding, we generate revenue from our annual fundraising events; family, private, and corporate giving foundations; Gaming, and individual donations.

CMMBA

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Provide an opportunity within the community for children of all ages and levels to try and learn about the sport of baseball. We provide a spring, summer and fall season. Spring is the biggest season with various levels of skill and ages playing each other. As they get older they play teams in other communities. We host tournaments, provide training for coaches and some children. We have some teams and players who have played at higher levels.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

Provide community sport.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

Put money towards the purchase of an outdoor transportable scoreboard to use for tournaments hosted by the league and season games.

Quote received is \$ for 6825 plus applicable taxes.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

Will help provide better organization for games and tournaments hosted.

Tournaments bring in people from other communities who tend to spend the day or days within our community and we reap the economic benefit. (Restaurants, shops, etc)

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

This group received \$ 1000 after doing a presentation. This was a couple years ago.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

Boston Pizza (Coquitlam Centre) supports CMMBA through its players and supporters. - Before you pay the bill at this location, make sure they know you're with CMMBA. They will then donate 10% of your check (including alcohol, but excluding taxes) to CMMBA.

Communities Embracing Restorative Action (CERA) Society

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

CERA's mandate is to enhance the quality of justice in the communities we serve through restorative measures. CERA is committed to working toward greater public justice, safety and community relationships with programs that intervene to assist youth involved with the law and the people they harm restore their relationship and to work for the prevention of future harm by teaching and supporting school students.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

The Society operates the Community Youth Justice Program; an effective alternative to the criminal court system for youth, and Empowering Youth; an effective training program for schoolchildren, following the principles and philosophy of restorative justice.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

The grant would support the organization in carrying out it's operations. Funds would be used towards staff salaries, office rent, and program supplies.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

- 1. Reduced police workload through: Each case processed is estimated to save 9 hours of police time.
- 2. Strengthened Community Capacity for Addressing Crime and Conflict in Port Moody
- 3. Safer Communities through Restored Relationships in Port Moody
- 4. Safer Schools in Port Moody: Through learning the importance of restorative values, students are much less likely to participate in offences.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

We have existed as an organization for 20 years, and have consistently received municipal funding. Our organization serves the municipalities of Port Moody, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, New Westminster, Anmore, and Belcarra.

We received funding through the City of Port Moody Police Board. Our most recent grant this past year was \$2000. We have received Community Foundation Grants from Coquitlam Foundation and PoCo Community Foundation. Our most recent grant from PoCo Community Foundation was last year, in the amount of \$3500

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

Yes, as described in the previous answer, we receive municipal and community funding from many municipalities, and furthermore, in addition to fiscal support, the police agencies and school districts are very supportive of the work that CERA does, which is confirmed by our 2 decade partnership.

Community Ventures Society

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Community Ventures Society (CVS) is a non-profit society based in Port Moody, serving individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. Our goals at CVS are to (1) open doors to opportunities for children and adults with developmental disabilities and their families so that they live the life they choose; (2) enhancing the quality of our services through advocacy, innovation and collaboration; and (3) inspire the community to join us in creating positive social change.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

We provide programs for adults with developmental disabilities that teach life skills, help find employment, offer recreation so the individuals we serve can live bigger, better lives. We help these individuals gain exposure to diverse experiences.

Amount of Grant Request

\$2,500

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

One of the biggest challenges for adults with developmental disabilities is the loneliness they experience in the evenings and weekends. We are not funded for this and would like to augment this into what we offer the individuals we serve.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

People with disabilities are part of our community but are often overlooked. These important members of our community will get new experiences from these evening activities, build new relationships and their families will get a break at the same time

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

We received a Federal grant for a Sensory room in 2019 but this will go towards our day programming only. Also, we have received small donations from the families of the individuals we serve.

Coquitlam Sharks Aquatic Club

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

The Coquitlam Sharks Aquatic Cub is a non profit aquatic club that was established 60 years ago. We provide quality year-round coaching in swimming, water polo, synchronized swimming and diving for all ages from development-level, novice swimmers, right through to provincial record holders.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

Our club is dedicated to inclusivity of all members, regardless of geographical location, gender, ethnicity, religion or ability. We are committed to developing and maintaining programs which will retain both recreational and competitive athletes in swimming, water polo, synchronized swimming and diving. We provide a positive and fun environment for young athletes, building a sense of community and encouraging a life long commitment to fitness.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

Registration fees only cover about 40% of our yearly expenses— the major costs our club is faced with are pool rentals, coaches' salaries, meet fees and replacing damaged equipment. With ever increasing costs, a main goal of the executive is to keep our fees affordable for all families. Therefore, we must rely on fundraising and donations to offset the cost to operate the programs of our club. As a Coquitlam Club it is challenging for us to seek financial funding for Port Moody residents. Curren

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

If the grant is approved funds will be used to ensure we can continue to provide these topnotch a winter swim program and water polo programing Port Moody residents have come to appreciate and participate in. Our aim is to ensure all young athletes, can participate and begin a life long commitment to fitness.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

We have not received funding from the City of Port Moody in the past.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

We have local support from community businesses such as Me & Ed's, Team Aquatics, Athletes Choice Competitive Swim Wear, KidSport, Athletics for Kids and Canadian Tire Jumpstart and provincially from the Province of British Columbia through youth employment initiatives.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

We have received Community Gaming Grant for \$7,000 for the past 6 plus years. In 2018 we received a \$1/hr wage increase from ECE Wage Enhancement Program, and \$10,000 from the Childcare BC maintenance Fund used for roof repair/replacement. In 2017 we received \$2,278.50 from Minor Capital Funding to replace rotten fence posts. Every year we apply for as many grants as we can to keep the school running and thriving. As a small preschool, we are only approved for a handful each year.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

As a co-operative non-profit we have relied heavily on grants, community support, and city funding throughout the program's history. The parents of students fundraise, volunteer their time, special skills and resources to keep the school running.

Inlet Skating Club of Port Moody

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

At Inlet, one can learn to skate for fun or be trained to skate competitively by certified Skate Canada coaches. Our goal is to promote all aspects of skating for enjoyment, fitness and personal achievement. We have CanSkate which is Skate Canada's flagship learn-to-skate program designed for all ages. After Canskate, skaters can continue their development with Skating Academy or our Teen/Adult StarSkate Program. For skaters focused on Hockey/Ringette, PrePower or CanPower Programs is next.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

Inlet is a friendly, positive, safe environment, where our skaters have fun, develop their skills, and enjoy success as they meet their individual skating goals. Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

With this grant Inlet would like to enhance our entry level program called "Canskate" by providing helmets and replacing some of our aged materials used to teach the class. Currently we do not have any helmets which is a hinderance for some families. As well, Inlet would like to buy a new banner and a portable canopy to attend community events. Attending Car-Free day increased awareness for Inlet but our volunteers were finding it difficult without shade. Our current banner is falling apart.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

By being a member at Inlet Skating Club, skaters will increase their fitness level and self esteem. Inlet families and skaters will expand their interests and social circles. People of all ages will have an opportunity to try something new - safely and families will develop stronger ties with their community.

By fostering youth and families through fitness and working together towards common goals will build healthy individuals and strong communities.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

- Educational workshops and training for refugees, newcomers and vulnerable people to help them understanding the Canadians culture and system in order to integrate them to our community effectively and smoothly.
- Organize events to increase public awareness regarding current issues that impact our community such as climate change and bullying in schools.
- Make referrals for other agencies and services that can response to our clients' needs.

Amount of Grant Request

\$3,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

The purpose of the grant is to help our organization continuing to do a series of educational workshops to prevent / reduce the cyber bullying and the bullying in schools which many of refugees , newcomers and vulnerable people struggle with it and prevent them to integrate into our community as they become isolated.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

The community will benefit from this service by helping the refugees, newcomers and vulnerable people to participate in our community effectively and to avoid the isolation. Most current researches indicate that the cyber bullying and bullying in schools have a significant impact on the refugees, newcomers, and vulnerable people. However, by providing these people with training and education on how to solve the bullying issues, and consequently, can encourage them to integrate to our community.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

This is the first time we apply for the community grant.

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

We do not have. This is the first time we apply for the community grant.

Pacific Post Partum Support Society

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Our mission is to end the isolation and distress experienced by many women and their families with the profound life change that accompanies the birth or adoption of a child.

Since 1971, our Society provides information, assessment, referrals and support to women and families dealing with postpartum depression, anxiety, and distress (PPD/A).

We are able to provide additional support to the mothers who are accessing medical services or who may be on a waitlist for mental health services.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

An estimated 1 out of every 6 women experiences depression or anxiety after the birth or adoption of a child. This can bring tremendous stress to the family, with child abuse, substance abuse, marital breakdown, chronic depression and suicide as possible outcomes. Our telephone support provides everyone with access to support, including trained telephone support volunteers who speak other languages to support mothers in their first language.

Last year our staff managed over 5,500 calls.

Amount of Grant Request

\$1,000

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

This grant would benefit our Telephone Support Counselling program, with support available Monday- Friday 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Telephone counselling is a very economical method of providing support to mothers and families coping with depression and anxiety. It has the potential of providing much-needed support for isolated women with little support and few resources.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

We support moms in the early months who may be on waitlists for other services, such as Reproductive Mental Health at BC Women's or Fraser Health Reproductive Mental Health. This is a huge benefit to the community as early intervention is essential for the well-being of the entire family. We provide this support until their youngest child is three years old.

All new mothers benefit from learning self-care strategies for coping with and reducing stress and knowing where to access resources.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

Do you have other community support or sponsorship? Please describe:

PPPSS is a collaborative, community-based organization, members of the Vancouver Coastal Health Authority's Perinatal Depression Leaders Group, and partners with and receives funding from Fraser Health Authority to run support groups in the FHA area.

Referrals to our services come from doctors, public health nurses, self-referrals and community organizations, with which we refer and consult with to continue assessing, to make sure moms receive the right resources.

POCOMO Meals on Wheels Society

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

The goal of our organisation is to provide hot, reasonably priced lunches to residents who, for a variety of reasons, are unable to make meals themselves. The clients can be somewhat isolated from others. Contact with our drivers is appreciated.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

Nutritious lunches are delivered, by our volunteer drivers, 5 days per week (with the option of extra frozen meals to use over the weekend). This service can help people remain in their own home longer. Drivers report it a client appears ill.

Amount of Grant Request

\$1,200

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

Port Moody individuals receiving our meals are comforted by warm meals and driver contact. Some of the stress of their family members is eased knowing that their loved one have food that is ready to eat, and that they have been seen during the day.

We have been fortunate to receive grants from the City of Port Moody, starting as far back as 1984!

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

St. John Ambulance's Medical First Responders (MFR) program is comprised of medically trained first aid volunteers that go into Port Moody and Tri-Cities communities to provide first aid and healthcare services. The funding will be used to purchase vital first aid equipment and supplies that our MFR teams routinely carry with them and use when they attend events, such as kits, tents, and AEDs. This will help our volunteers increase their capacity to attend more events.

If the grant is approved, how will the community benefit?

Majority of community events require first aid on site to be able to operate, stressing the importance of first aid services. First aid is vital in ensuring that public events, whether it has a small or large attendance, are safe and, in case of an emergency, have immediate medical attention to treat the injury and keep people out of hospitals. The program also improves healthcare, safety, and learning among community members, while also promoting volunteerism in the community.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

We received Community Grant funding in 2017 for \$5,000 to support our St. John Ambulance volunteers in the Tri-Cities.

Community support is evident in the continuous interest and demand for our MFR volunteers in the community. Volunteer Cancer Drivers Society

Organization Information

What is your organization's goals, objectives and activities?

Our Mission is provide free, personalized and compassionate transportation to treatment for all cancer patients in need during their life-threatening journey. Public transit is stressful, impractical, frequently unavailable and for most patients seldom a viable option. Our drivers, using their own vehicles, transport patients from their homes to their care facility, wait during patient treatment (often up to 4 hours or more) and provide the return trip home.

What service does your organization provide to the community?

In 2020 we will provide over 315 rides for Port Moody resident cancer patients, requiring 11,000 km of travel at a cost of \$5,280

What is the purpose of the grant and the proposed allocation of funds?

The grant will be used to provide a \$0.48/km vehicle reimbursement to our volunteer drivers transporting Port Moody cancer patients. (the CRA allowance is \$0.58 km).

We ease the physical, emotional and financial burden for these cancer patients and for thousands of their families and supporters by ensuring loved ones can attend all their treatments safely and on time.

What City funding have you received in the past? If you received Community Grant funding in the past, in what year and how much was awarded?

The VCDS received a \$1,000 City of Port Moody Grant in 2018 and \$2,000 in 2019.
