Drafted Sports Award - including Youth Sports Award within the criteria

CRITERIA:

- 1. Nominees must have been a resident of Port Moody at the time of the noted achievement or reason for nomination;
- 2. Nominees will be considered for their exceptional contributions that have furthered the growth, reputation, character of sport in areas that may include, but are not limited to, administration, performing or coaching/officiating;
- 3. Nominees must be identifiable under at least one of the three primary categories:

Athlete

- The nominee must have represented sport with distinction in athletic competition, both in Port Moody and outside the City, or whose example has brought great credit to the sport and high respect for the individual.
- The nominee must have compiled an outstanding record in one or more sports.
- The nominee must be an individual with substantial connections to Port Moody.
- The nominee must have reached ultimate achievement in their sport and performed in a manner to bring special honour and recognition to the City of Port Moody.
- The nominee must have been either a resident of Port Moody at birth, or lived in or attended school in Port Moody for a minimum of 5 years.
- A resident of Port Moody who is/was a member of a (Canadian) National or International team may stand for induction as an individual athlete.

Builder

- The category of builder shall include coaches, officials, administrators, patrons, media (journalists/broadcasters) and sports medicine practitioners.
- The nominee must have served sport for a substantial number of years.
- The nominee must have had a substantial career which made a contribution to sport of an outstanding nature.
- The nominee must be an individual with substantial connections to Port Moody.

Team

- Port Moody teams winning a national, international, or world championship, or reaching the ultimate level of achievement in their sport, may be eligible for entry into the Sports Memorabilia Display.
- Generally speaking, in a sport where athletes compete in individual events, the team will not be eligible for a team induction.
- A team is not a team if the team result is derived on the basis of a calculation of individual scores.
- Teams could be selected for their achievements in one year, or for an accumulative sport history.

Youth Sports Award

- Be aged 12 to 19 years old
- Actively participating in a recognized provincial sport that shows evidence of high athletic ability and performance results
- Pursuing and achieving sport performances leading towards podium placements at provincial, national and international competitions
- Demonstrating the qualities of leadership, coachability, strong work ethic, and the characteristics of fair play both on and off the field of play
- Demonstrating a commitment to academic studies and continued education
- Demonstrating how their experience in sport is shaping their future
- 4. Nominees must be identifiable under at least one of the five secondary categories:
 - Significant Personal Achievement
 - Sportsmanship
 - Historical Contribution/Pioneer
 - Leadership
 - Novelty/Unique Contribution to Sport

NOMINATION PROCESS:

- 1. Each nomination must be supported by two (2) separate nominates or references.
- 2. The Youth Focus Committee will be asked to put forth nominations to the Parks and Recreation Commission for the Youth Focus Award
- 3. One winner must be awarded with the Youth Sports Award.
- 4. Attachments will be encouraged to support nominations and may include photos, media clips, medals, jerseys, trophies, etc. (or photos of these items)

Winning nominations will be asked to provide personal and/or professional items for showcasing in the Sports Memorabilia Display for a period of up to one year and be invited to the Committee Volunteer Dinner for the award presentation.
