Proclamation

WHEREAS, Celiac Disease (CD) is an autoimmune disorder whereby the intestinal

lining is damaged by gluten, a protein found in wheat, rye and barley. CD occurs when gluten triggers an immune system reaction that damages the small intestine, thus impairing absorption of nutrients required to stay

healthy; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that about 350,000 people in Canada have CD but the

majority of these people are not diagnosed. British Columbians need to be

better informed that Celiac Disease is not a rare disease; and

WHEREAS, research from Canada has shown that the average time from symptom

onset to diagnosis of CD in adults averages close to 12 years; and

WHEREAS, all British Columbians need to be aware that early detection is critical.

Untreated, CD can be dangerous, event deadly, and can lead to

malnutrition, causing anemia, osteoporosis and cancer of the gut; and
