Subject: Funding Source for COVID-19 Related Temporary Slow Zone and Road Reallocation Projects

At the Regular Council meeting held on July 28, 2020, Council considered a report dated June 24, 2020 from the Engineering and Operations Department – Infrastructure Engineering Services Division regarding Potential COVID-19 Related Temporary Slow Zone and Road Reallocation Projects (**Attachment 1**) and passed the following resolution:

RC20/303

THAT the temporary slow zones on St. George Street between Buller Street and Albert Street be implemented until the end of summer 2021 unless conditions and monitoring indicate that temporary changes are no longer providing benefit as recommended in the report dated June 24, 2020 from the Engineering and Operations Department – Infrastructure Engineering Services Division regarding Potential COVID-19 Related Temporary Slow Zone and Road Reallocation Projects;

AND THAT staff continue to monitor traffic and active transportation activity in case it warrants further consideration of road reallocation projects or additional slow zones;

AND THAT the up to \$9,000 required to implement the temporary slow zones and related communication plans be forwarded to the Finance Committee to identify a funding source.

The up to \$9,000 required to implement the temporary slow zones and related communication plans is now before the Finance Committee for identification of a funding source. Staff recommend the Capital Asset Reserve – Transportation Envelope as a funding source.

The recommended resolution is:

**THAT the up to \$9,000 required to implement the temporary slow zones and related communication plans be funded from the Capital Asset Reserve – Transportation Envelope as recommended in the memo dated September 4, 2020 from the Finance and Technology Department – Financial Services Division regarding Funding Source for COVID-19 Related Temporary Slow Zone and Road Reallocation Projects.**
