 - Connectivity and impact
 - Need to tie different neighbourhoods together
 - Seek pedestrian movement beyond Rocky Point Park and Brewers Row
 - Effective wayfinding will have economic development impacts along with supporting tourism, heritage, and arts and culture
 - Tourism Committee had been planning surveys for major events to measure economic impact - could use this initiative to also consult with people about their ability to navigate the city and use this as baseline data

Audience

- For people living and working here raise awareness of other features and amenities
- First-time and infrequent visitors

Content

- Compile list of points of interest particularly from the Heritage Commission and Arts and Culture Committees e.g. stone markers, public art, cultural events
- Depends on format analogue versus digital (City of Coquitlam recently installed a digital kiosk by the Lafarge Lake/Douglas SkyTrain station)
- City has extensive guidelines on signage standards but opportunity to explore unique signage (e.g. Coquihalla Highway)

Implementation

- Work within existing capital and replacement cycles
- 2021 budget discussions are also upcoming in September
- Budget may be available to secure wayfinding consultant but also need funds to execute plan
- Perhaps federal funding to support initiatives that enhance active transportation especially walking

Next steps

- Inventory of existing kiosks
- Ask City of Coquitlam Manager of Tourism about new City Centre Community Hub digital kiosk
- Aim for Council report for wayfinding consultant RFP in September
